# **Overview**

Founded in 2014 as a cross-ministry hub for systemic design and strategic foresight, Alberta CoLab is a **space**, a **team**, and an **approach** based in the Government of Alberta's Department of Energy.

# Alberta CoLab is a Space.

CoLab's custom-built studio is designed to help shift the way the Government of Alberta navigates its most complex challenges: through collaboration, co-design, and co-creation. It is a pretty cool space, because the walls are all whiteboards and the furniture is all on wheels!

Designed for maximum flexibility and extreme visualization, the CoLab provides a space for up to 30 people to work together to visualize and prototype innovative solutions.

## Alberta CoLab is a Team.

Alberta CoLab is staffed by a small – but mighty! – team skilled in foresight, systemic design, and design facilitation. We are backed by communities of practice that span the Government of Alberta. Our team has diverse backgrounds and skillsets, but we share common values and a mindset that is open, inquiring, and forward-looking.

# Alberta CoLab is an Approach.

At CoLab, we do strategy and policy differently. Our approach involves:

- Starting with the needs of Albertans.
- Collaborating across boundaries with unusual suspects.
- Scanning for weak signals and digging for deep drivers.
- Embracing complexity and ambiguity.
- Making our thinking tangible by creating and visualizing together.
- Building robustness and adaptability for an unknown future.
- Learning by doing, and iterating between action and reflection.

# **Our Work**

Since its inception, CoLab - known within the Department of Energy as the Energy Transition and Policy Innovation Unit (ETPI) - has assisted with many of the Government of Alberta's most complex strategy and policy challenges. This is where we believe we can be most useful: on challenges that lie at the intersection of departmental and organizational boundaries. These challenges are complex - we refer to them as messes, and it is our job to work with others to tackle them.

Our work starts when:


- Best practices are no longer working or there aren't any.
- You aren't sure where to start, or exactly what the problem is.
- You want to experiment with a new idea or approach, but aren't sure how.
- You want to go beyond what is to explore alternative possible futures.
- You want to understand whether you are doing the right things, not whether you are doing things right.



#### **Services**

CoLab's efforts are focused in four key service areas:

- Projects: working with project partners in the following areas (in order of priority): Energy System, Integrated Resource Management System (IRMS), Government/Cross-ministry Initiatives, and Innovation Spaces.
- Capacity Building: education, training, and collaborative practitioner forums (e.g., Communities of Practice) to make accessible and imbed mindset, methodologies, and tools.
- **Field Building:** outward-facing engagements to build the field of expertise and leverage additional resources. This includes building a network of labs, chairing and presenting at conferences, and partnerships with experts in related fields.
- Advisory Services: providing technical and strategic advice in our areas of expertise - energy related technological innovation, emissions, and public sector innovation.



While, in many ways, CoLab operates like an in-house consultancy for the Government of Alberta, we are not consultants. We are public servants. We're not in the market for clients; we're open to project partnerships with folks who share our values – partnerships that enable us to use our skillsets to support other **public servants pushing boundaries to benefit Albertans**.
